

Visitor Restrictions

EFFECTIVE: 02/28/2022

Pulaski Memorial Hospital is taking steps to protect our patients, their families, and staff by temporarily limiting visitation in our hospital. Visitor restrictions have been put into place to help minimize the spread of respiratory illnesses such as Influenza and COVID-19.

All visitors will be asked to self-screen for COVID-19 symptoms. Anyone within PMH facilities must wear a mask. Failure to properly wear a mask over their mouth and nose may result in individuals being asked to leave the premises.

Inpatients on our Medical/Surgical Unit may have two (2) visitors, 18 years or older, at any time. Visitors may come and go freely throughout the day. Rotating visitors should remain outside until previous visitors leave. Visitation hours will be between 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM. Visitors of COVID-19 positive patients must wear appropriate personal protective equipment.

- Pediatric Patients may have both parents/legal guardians present at a time. Two (2) additional visitors 18 years or older may come and go freely at any time. Rotating visitors should remain outside until previous visitors leave. Visitation hours will be between 7:00 AM - 8:00 PM.
- Patients receiving Outpatient procedures may have one (1) support person with them throughout the procedure.
- Emergency Department patients may have one (1) support person. Additional visitors may be allowed at the discretion of the charge nurse.
- If a patient is critically or terminally ill, a nurse manager or charge nurse for the unit may allow additional visitors. Visitors will be limited to two (2) people at a time. Rotating visitors should wait outside until previous visitors leave.

The Nursing Staff or Physician On Duty will ultimately determine if visitation can be accommodated.
