Visitor Restrictions

Pulaski Memorial Hospital is taking steps to protect our patients, their families, and staff by temporarily limiting visitation in our hospital. Visitor restrictions have been put into place to help minimize the spread of respiratory illness such as Influenza and Coronavirus.

**AT THIS TIME NO VISITORS WILL BE PERMITTED
IN PULASKI MEMORIAL HOSPITAL.**

During this unprecedented time, a support person for the patients described below may be critical to avoid negative health outcomes unrelated to the COVID-19 public health emergency. All support persons must screen negative with no symptoms or elevated temperature, as addressed in the screening questions.

- OB Patients may have one (1) adult support person remain with them during delivery.
- Emergency Department patients may have one (1) support person to assist with additional consent needs and discharge.
- Patients receiving Outpatient Surgery may have one (1) support person for additional consent needs and discharge.
- Pediatric Patients may have both parents/legal guardians designated, but only one (1) support person may be present at a time.
- If a patient is critically or terminally ill, a nurse manager or charge nurse for the unit may allow additional visitors. Visitors will be limited to two (2) immediate family members (or any person the patient designates) at a time. Immediate family members include spouse/significant other, children, parents, siblings, grandparents, grandchildren, in-laws, and step-relations.

The Nursing Staff or Physician On Duty will ultimately determine if visitation can be accommodated.
